
## **Qualification Aims and Objectives**

Psychology is the rigorous and systematic study of mental processes and behaviour. At the core of the IB Psychology course is an introduction to three different approaches to understanding behaviour:

- biological approach to understanding behaviour
- cognitive approach to understanding behaviour
- sociocultural approach to understanding behaviour

The aims of the IB Psychology course include to:

- develop and apply an understanding of the biological, cognitive and sociocultural factors affecting mental processes and behaviour
- understand diverse methods of inquiry
- ensure that ethical practices are upheld in all psychological inquiry and discussion
- develop an awareness of how psychological research can be applied to address real-world problems and promote positive change

- Approaches to researching behaviour

The qualification is intended to carry UCAS points and is recognised by Higher Education providers as contributing to meeting admission requirements for many courses if taken alongside other qualifications as part of a two year programme of learning, and it combines well with a large number of subjects. It will support entry to HE courses in a very wide range of disciplines, depending on the subjects taken alongside.
